



DAILY SUMMARY

The Iran–U.S. Trigger List

Tehran 21 October

The Financial Action Task Force [announced](#) Iran’s continued classification as a high-risk jurisdiction subject to a call for action, one of two countries on the FATF’s blacklist.

Israel 21 October

An Israeli minister [contended](#) that “a confrontation with Iran is only a matter of time, and not a lot of time... no diplomatic process or agreement will stop Iran’s nuclear program”.

Tanf/Washington 20 October

U.S. Central Command [confirmed](#) “a deliberate and coordinated attack” at al-Tanf, which “utilised both unmanned aerial systems and indirect fire”. A CENTCOM spokesperson stated that “we are not aware of any injuries to U.S. personnel at this time”, going on to assert that “we maintain the inherent right of self-defence and will respond at a time and place of our choosing”.

Yemen/Riyadh 20 October

The UN Security Council [denounced](#) “Huthi cross-border attacks against Saudi Arabia... [and] the increasing number of incidents off the coast of Yemen, including attacks on civilian and commercial ships”. The members urged “an immediate nationwide ceasefire, in accordance with resolution 2565 (2021), and called for the resolution of differences through inclusive dialogue and the rejection of violence to achieve political goals”. The council also “called on all Member States and other actors to comply fully with their obligations under the targeted arms embargo”.
